Refurbishment of Bishop and Son Organ.

On 14th October 1993 the Vestry entered into a contract with George Stephens Organ Builder Pty Ltd to undertake substantial restoration work and make additions to the instrument. The Schedule of Work was as follows:
Dismantle organ and remove to workshop.

Building Frame

Repair split timber or replace if necessary with matching timber of same dimension. Extend this structure to accommodate additional ranks of pipes, using matching solid timber of the same dimensions and profile as the existing.

Manual Soundboards

Strip down both Swell and Great soundboards, flood bars with animal glue, plane table tops, refit sliders and upper boards.

Releather pallets and set pallet springs to correct tension.

Replace any worn or faulty material with components and materials matching as closely as possible to the original.

Pedal Soundboard

Strip down and flood bars with glue. Releather pallets and replace any worn or faulty materials with those which match the original as closely as possible.

Swell Box

Extend Swell Box to accommodate new Trumpet rank using timber and other materials as close as possible to the existing.

Refit louvres and make new trace rod. Change the Swell mechanism to a balanced system, the Swell pedal to be fitted at the right hand side of the console (diagonally).

The original Swell hitch pedal and mechanism will be preserved after disconnection in a location to be determined by the commissioners.

Manual And Pedal Rollerboards

Rebush and/or fit new roller pins. Releather eyes.

Action

Rebush and/or repin all square beams, back falls and couplers.

Make new trackers as required.

Replace all leather buttons and felt washers.

Repin drawstop mechanism.

Make necessary additions and alterations

to drawstop mechanism, including the stop knob and labels, of a similar design to the original using materials matching as closely as possible to the original, to accommodate additional ranks of pipes.

Manual Keyboards

Rebush all keys and replace any worn or faulty material

Replace badly worn and discoloured Ivory with secondhand Ivory material where practical.

Pedalboard

Recover all keys and rebush throughout.

Wind Ducts

Make good all wind ducts and conveyances, removing any noncompatible materials.

Install the blower inside the organ complete with soundproof cabinet and fittings.

Restore the original wind control box.

Tremulant And Swell Concussion Bellows

Restore existing Tremulant and fit a cover to help reduce any noise

Releather the Swell concussion bellows which has been disconnected and fit a device to turn it off when the Tremulant is on.

Wood Pipes

Repair and clean all of these and refit stoppers.

Revoice as required, as close as possible to the original voicing.

Metal Pipes

The metal pipework is fitted with tuning slides.

Repair and clean all metal pipework and fit new tuning slides throughout.

Revoice as required, as close as possible to the original voicing.

Façade Pipes

Repair broken tuning tongues and wash the pipes with a mild soap and water, leaving intact the present stencilling and painting of the pipes.

Composition Pedals

Repin existing pedals and install two new ones for the Swell division, of the same design and using similar materials to the existing.

Casework

Strip to timber.

Where possible, fill holes, repair cracks
