It is referred to as Block 1, Section 248, Hd of Adelaide. In March 1848 (when her address was given as Mitcham), she sold 2 acres (0.81 ha) to Edward Conway for £24, and in August sold two strips adjoining this land to Reverend W.J. Woodcock for £8 who then purchased the 2 acres from Conway for £45. (Mem.297 Bk 6; Mem.393 Bk 10; Mem.154 Bk 13; Mem.263 Bk 16 (GRO). Apparently a house was built on it, because on 31 May 1853 he sold this holding of 2 ½ acres (1.01 ha) to Rev'd E.H. Burnett for £200, and when Burnett sold it in July 1855 to James N. Smith, a draper, for £500 it was described as "3 pieces of land and dwelling" (Mem.18 Bk 52; Mem.46 Bk 89).

from Braithwaite to Woodcock on 25 May 1853 (Mem. 478 Bk 51). On 31 May 1853 Woodcock sold this holding of 2 ½ acres (1.01 ha) to Rev'd E.H. Burnett for £200 (Mem. 18 Bk 52), and when Burnett sold it in July 1855 to James N. Smith, a draper, for £500 it was described as "3 pieces of land and dwelling" (Mem. 46 Bk 89).

CHAPTER 14

1. *Block 1 land transactions. On 30 May 1846 Elizabeth Bayley, a widow of Kensington, bought 10 acres (4.05 ha) in the NW corner of Mitcham Village for £75. It is referred to as Block 1, Section 248, Hd of Adelaide. In March 1848 (when her address was given as Mitcham), she sold 2 acres (0.81 ha) to Edward Conway for £24, and in August sold two strips adjoining this land to Reverend W.J. Smith, a draper, for £500 it was described as "3 pieces of land and dwelling" (Mem.18 Bk 52; Mem.46 Bk 89).*
